2. **Define Your Subject:** “You teach online students in a class about health psychology”, “Your students are at various levels of achievement”, “Your students are online students”, “Your students are ground traditional students at a private/public university”, “Your audience is online faculty”
3. **Explain the Task:** “Your task is to write content for an online course”, “Please create a discussion forum question”, “Please create a formative assessment on the following topic”, “Your task is to create ten slides on the following presentation topic”, “Create a rubric, include the following sections”
